Messages from the Board




Please join us for our **Summer Meeting** and **Awards Ceremony** for the 2022 and 2023 FFVF winners.

The Chattanooga Chapter of FFVF sponsored 6 local area high school students and a chaperone to attend the Spirit of America Student Leadership Program on the Freedoms Foundation Campus at Valley Forge, PA from March 9-12, 2023. Students were selected through the FFVF annual essay contest. Chattanooga Chapter VP for Youth & Education, Pam Fields accompanied the 6 students: Taylor Barrett, Isaac Linville, Jacob Long, John Southerland, Brooke Williams, and John Wood, representing several different schools. Our program included about 100 students and chaperones from across the country.

The Spirit of America Youth Leadership Program is crafted for high school students interested in cultivating a better understanding of the rights and responsibilities of citizenship through thought-provoking and engaging activities. Led by an outstanding and experienced faculty and staff, students participate in a mock congressional debate, a lesson in writing and rhetoric conducted by none other than Thomas Jefferson, a free enterprise challenge, and leadership development workshops. They hear from dynamic speakers and living historian reenactors on topics regarding U.S. history, government, and economics with a focus on our freedoms, responsible citizenship, and free enterprise.

Accompanied by expert guides, our students saw history come alive as they walked the hallowed grounds of Valley Forge National Park and visited numerous historic sites throughout historic Philadelphia. Our Philly tour included Independence Hall, Congress Hall, the Liberty Bell Center, Washington's house, Franklin's house and print shop, Franklin's grave at Christ Church Burial Ground, the Philadelphia Mint, and the National Constitution Center. We also tried Philly Cheesesteak sandwiches before heading to the airport!

Along with a thorough understanding of civic responsibility, our students left inspired to do their part in securing the blessings of liberty only an active citizenry can safeguard, guided by a greater appreciation for our country's history, ideals, and the relevance of our country's founding documents. While our students probably felt as if they were drinking from a firehose of information in those 4 short days, each one remarked that he/she

had not really known what to expect but that it had been a truly life-changing experience he/she would never forget!
