Charlotte K. Perry “Joy of Giving”

Charlotte Perry was given a solid foundation of the satisfaction and rewards of volunteerism by her family.

After a 40-year career as an educator and librarian in this country as well as Germany, she retired from school life and began a whole new phase as a “volunteer extraordinaire.”

Charlotte volunteered in a myriad of activities, her favorite of which is working with children. Known for her consummate leadership and fund-raising activities, she has chaired or presided over several charitable organizations. She has co-chaired the “Light One Little Candle Foundation” for 20 years, providing books for the Children’s Library at Moores Cancer Center. With the military she was instrumental in helping to develop the Veterans Memorial Center and serves as a trustee.

Honored by many organizations for her accomplishments, Charlotte feels the “joy of giving.” She is a hero of citizenship and a patriot who is caring and compassionate.



Magnolia Project: Regina and James Gamboa

For many years Regina and James Gamboa distributed food to South San Diego families in need, sometimes from a garage, but a dream came true when they opened their Magnolia “Store” in Imperial Beach. This unique food pantry allows folks to pick out healthy, often fresh, food. In addition, there is a fully equipped kitchen where they provide cooking lessons to the community. “Our primary emphasis is on healthy nutrition for underserved families,” Regina explained.

They wanted a welcoming place which would allow folks of differing ethnicities to find food appropriate to their cultures, and to learn how to use food that is new to them. This project is funded by grants from Aetna, UCSD Medical, and the district attorney’s office as well as individual donations and money from the Gamboas themselves. Magnolia continues its practice of providing food, but perhaps more importantly; it nurtures individuals and families with ideas for better nutrition and a healthier future.

Operation Dress Code is a collaborative program designed to empower women currently serving in the military and those who previously served by providing them with the professional clothing needed to transition to the civilian workforce.

The boutique is the focal point, but Operation Dress Code is about more than a new business jacket or pair of shoes; it’s about an experience. It’s about creating a safe space where women help women, where our female veterans can recover, recharge and reimagine their post-military lives.

The pop-up boutique is created in ONE day, which means a small army is needed to transition an empty conference center into a beautiful boutique.

Volunteers assist in hanging clothes, unpacking accessories and arranging the room to provide a high-quality shopping experience. Women veterans deserve the best and Operation Dress Code works hard to provide them with the most nurturing, supportive and empowering environment possible.



Mt. Soledad National Veterans Memorial Honoring Veterans by Preserving Their Legacy



Mt. Soledad National Veterans Memorial is one of the most unique Veterans memorials in America which honors Veterans, living and deceased, from the Revolutionary War to the current "Global War on Terror." The walls list more than names; they are made up of black granite plaques featuring the stories, pictures and accomplishments of the brave men and women who have served our country and our allied forces.

Honorees include presidents and twelve Medal of Honor recipients, Generals, celebrity veterans and many other veterans with names of which are not familiar, but who proudly served our country

helping to preserve the freedoms we enjoy as Americans.

Mt. Soledad Association owns and operates the Mt. Soledad National Veterans Memorial solely through the purchase of plaques, with zero federal funding.

The Association believes that service members should know how grateful their nation is for their sacrifice as well as their service.



Alyssa Huckleberry

Alyssa Huckleberry is a 5th Grade teacher at Willow Grove Elementary in Poway Unified School District in San Diego, CA. She is also the author of eight young adult and children’s books. Ms. Huckleberry is a phenomenal teacher in all subjects at the elementary level. However, Ms. Huckleberry truly makes history come *alive* for her students. Through the interactive “Colonial Day” students take on the role of a fictionalized character who might have lived in Williamsburg, Virginia. Throughout the experience, students visit the schoolhouse, ballroom, tavern, and field to learn colonial crafts, participation in a 1700’s school, learn colonial dances, play colonial games, and enjoy colonial treats – all leaving a lasting impression on her students.

Ms. Huckleberry recently wrote, “History is often taught through textbooks and the memorization of dates and facts...but memorable, impressionable experiences come when students *experience history*.”


