Freedoms Foundation at Valley Forge was established in 1949 by prominent business leaders Don Belding, E.F. Hutton, and Dr. Ken Wells, to foster patriotism and good citizenship through educational programs. President Dwight D. Eisenhower served as chair or chair emeritus until his death in 1969.

Education Programs

Today, our educational programs for students and teachers range from U.S. History, citizenship, constitutional rights, entrepreneurship, public policy issues and the American political process:

- History Encounters education travel program for elementary and middle school students
- Spirit of America Youth Leadership Program for teens
- Service Learning in Public Policy for college bound teens

Volunteer Chapters
